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Internal Regulatory Enactment of Madona Municipality No. 11

Madona, 5 December 2025

Issued pursuant to Section 10, Paragraph one, Clause 2 of the Law on Safety of Public Entertainment and Festive Events

Round of the Sidecarcross World Championship and Quadcross European Championship VISITOR REGULATIONS

I. General Provisions

1.1. Madona Municipality (hereinafter – the Organiser) is the sole representative in Latvia which, on the basis of a licence / agreement, organises at the “Smeceres sils” motocross track in Madona the seventh round of the Sidecarcross World Championship and a round of the Quadcross European Championship in 2026 (hereinafter – the Event).

1.2. The purchase and possession of an admission ticket and/or being present at the Event venue shall constitute confirmation that visitors have read and agree to these Regulations.

II. Admission Ticket

2.1. Admission tickets to the Event can be purchased at Bīlešu Paradīze ticket offices (including Madona Municipality Culture Centre and cinema “Vidzeme”), on the website www.bilesuparadize.lv, and at the ticket office of the Sports and Recreation Base “Smeceres sils”. Tickets will also be available for purchase at the entrance to the Event (in cash or by payment card).

2.2. Only admission tickets purchased at Bīlešu Paradīze ticket offices and/or on the website, as well as at the Sports and Recreation Base “Smeceres sils” ticket office, are valid for attending the Event.

2.3. Copying, duplicating, forging and/or unauthorised reproduction of admission tickets is strictly prohibited and is a criminal offence.

2.4. The Organiser shall immediately notify law-enforcement authorities regarding persons who distribute or use forged admission tickets to enter the Event. The risk of using duplicate admission tickets shall be borne by the person who has purchased them.

2.5. Damaged or forged admission tickets are invalid, and the Organiser does not accept them back.

2.6. The Organiser assumes no responsibility for unused admission tickets; no refunds are made for such tickets.

2.7. Visitors must retain their admission ticket for the entire duration of the Event so that it can be checked if necessary.

III. Access to the Event

3.1. Visitors must present their admission ticket in printed form or digitally on a smart device to the ticket controller at the entrance to the Event venue.

3.2. Visitors may enter the Event only with a valid admission ticket containing an individual and unique QR code or barcode.

3.3. Upon the visitor's entry to the Event venue, the unique QR code or barcode on the admission ticket will be read (scanned), and an Event wristband will be issued in exchange.

3.4. By presenting a valid Event wristband, a visitor may leave the Event venue and re-enter it.

3.5. The Organiser assumes no responsibility if the QR code or barcode on the admission ticket presented by the visitor no longer allows entry to the Event venue.

3.6. The Organiser assumes no responsibility for admission tickets whose QR codes or barcodes cannot be read (scanned) at the entrance to the Event and/or have already been scanned once.

3.7. If it is established that there are visitors at the Event venue without an admission ticket, they shall be expelled from the venue and/or, depending on the circumstances, a decision shall be taken on handing them over to law-enforcement officers.

3.8. The Organiser reserves the right to block the QR code or barcode of a visitor's admission ticket if the visitor has been expelled from the Event venue due to inappropriate behaviour or for any other reason.

3.9. If, for the sake of general safety of other spectators and the Event, a visitor is expelled from the Event venue, they shall not be allowed to re-enter the Event venue even if they purchase another ticket.

IV. Standard tickets

4.1. A standard Event admission ticket is intended for any person who is at least 18 years of age and does not fall within any category entitled to a discount for attending the Event.

4.2. One Event ticket is intended for one person.

4.3. Standard ticket categories and prices, based on the set periods during which ticket prices change, are indicated below.

V. Persons with Disabilities

5.1. Free admission is provided for persons with Group I or Group II disability (upon presentation of a valid Group I or Group II disability card).

5.2. Free admission is provided for children with disabilities aged 7 to 17 (included) (upon presentation of a valid disability card).

5.3. A reduced admission ticket price applies to companions of persons with Group I and Group II disabilities and to companions of children with disabilities. The ticket price for Saturday, 25 July, is 5 EUR for the whole period, and for Sunday, 26 July, the ticket price is 5 EUR for the whole period. The two-day ticket price for 25 and 26 July is 10 EUR.

5.4. At the entrance to the Event venue, a person with a disability must present a valid document confirming their disability. If a person cannot present a disability-confirming document, the Organiser reserves the right not to admit either the person with a disability or their companion free of charge or with a companion ticket.

5.5. One person with a disability may have only one assistant-companion.

VI. Children and Youth

6.1. Children up to 6 years of age (inclusive) are admitted to the Event free of charge.

6.2. Youth from 7 to 17 years of age (inclusive) are eligible for reduced-price admission tickets. Reduced ticket prices for this age category are indicated below.

6.3. At the entrance to the Event, all children and young persons up to 17 years of age (inclusive) must present a personal / age-confirming document together with their admission ticket.

6.4. Children and youth under 16 years of age must be under the supervision of adults (parents or guardians) at the Event venue for the entire duration of the Event. Parents or guardians are personally responsible for the children and youth under their supervision, as well as for their safety. The Organiser assumes no responsibility for the safety of children and youth if they do not comply with these Visitor Regulations or are not under the supervision of adults at the Event venue.

6.5. The sale of alcoholic beverages at the Event venue takes place in accordance with the Law on Circulation of Alcoholic Beverages, which stipulates that alcoholic beverages may not be sold to persons under 18 years of age.

6.6. Sidecar motorcycles and quad bikes are loud – the Organiser recommends that children use hearing-protection headphones at the Event.

VII. Pensioners

7.1. A reduced admission ticket price applies to pensioners (upon presentation of an identity document and an old-age pensioner card). The ticket price for Saturday, 25 July, is 5 EUR for the whole period, and for Sunday, 26 July, the ticket price is 10 EUR for the whole period. The two-day ticket price for 25 and 26 July is 15 EUR.

7.2. The reduced admission price does not apply to service-pension recipients or to pensioners who do not hold an pensioner card issued in Latvia.

VIII. Large families

8.1. A reduced admission ticket price applies to large families (upon presentation of the “Latvian Honorary Family Certificate – 3+ Family Card”):

8.1.1. Children up to 17 years of age (included) – free admission;

8.1.2. Children from 18 to 24 years of age, parents (one or both), guardians – 50% discount off the current ticket price;

8.1.3. It is necessary to present an identity document and confirmation of the right to use the “3+ Family Card”.

IX. Commercial restrictions

9.1. Without prior agreement with the Organiser, it is strictly prohibited to use the Event, the Event website, the Event social media accounts or Event admission tickets in advertising and marketing campaigns, raffles, promotions, lotteries, contests and/or other activities.

9.2. Any activity that may create a misleading impression of cooperation with the Organiser is prohibited.

9.3. Only with the Organiser's written permission may trade, marketing and advertising activities and/or other activities aiming to obtain a benefit or promote a particular product and/or service be carried out at the Event venue.

9.4. Conducting any commercial activity at the Event venue without prior written consent of the Organiser is prohibited.

9.5. If unapproved trade, marketing and advertising activities and/or other activities not agreed with the Organiser are detected at the Event venue, the Organiser has the right to immediately expel the offender from the Event venue.

9.6. In the event of a breach of the ticket regulations, the offender shall be liable for all losses caused to the Organiser, including for the loss of the organisational agreement/licence, etc., or any other losses incurred as a result of such breach of these Regulations.

X. Event

10.1. By being present at the Event venue, the visitor agrees that they may be filmed and/or photographed during the Event, and that their image or video footage featuring them may be used for commercial purposes, including advertising, without remuneration and without application of copyright.

10.2. Event visitors are prohibited from filming the Event if the material is used for commercial purposes.

10.3. Event visitors are prohibited from photographing the Event if the resulting photographs are used for commercial purposes.

10.4. The visitor agrees that, for security reasons, they may be subject to checks of personal belongings and/or identity documents / personal identity at the Event venue.

10.5. The Organiser has the right to change the Event programme without prior notice.

10.6. If the Event is postponed or cancelled, the visitor shall not be reimbursed for any travel expenses incurred in travelling to the Event, accommodation costs or any other expenses or service charges, but only the amount paid for the admission ticket.

10.7. The Event Organiser assumes no responsibility for the quality of food, beverages and other goods sold, or services provided at the Event venue. Full responsibility for the quality of food, beverages and other goods sold, and services provided at the Event venue lies with the respective service provider or seller.

10.8. The Event Organiser assumes no responsibility for inspections and/or actions carried out at the Event venue by state authorities/institutions.

10.9. The sale of alcoholic beverages at the Event venue takes place in accordance with the Law on Circulation of Alcoholic Beverages, which stipulates that alcoholic beverages may not be sold to persons under 18 years of age and such persons may not purchase them. In order to verify a person's age, the retailer is obliged to request that the person present an identity document. Persons aged 18 to 25, when purchasing alcoholic beverages, must present an identity document to the retailer in all cases, regardless of whether the retailer has requested it.

10.10. Energy drinks may not be sold to persons under 18 years of age and such persons may not purchase them. In order to verify the buyer's age, the retailer is obliged to request that the buyer present an identity document. At the request of the retailer or a representative of the supervisory and control authority, the buyer is obliged to confirm their identity and age by presenting an identity document.

10.11. The service provider or specific seller has the right to refuse to sell alcoholic beverages to Event visitors who are under the influence of alcohol or other intoxicating substances and may endanger themselves or others.

10.12. At the Event venue, it is prohibited to film and/or make sound recordings, play music or sound recordings using sound amplification equipment, or publicly broadcast video.

10.13. Event visitors are obliged to comply with those rules and requirements not mentioned in these Regulations but communicated by the Organiser during or prior to the Event.

10.14. If a visitor is expelled from the Event venue due to inappropriate behaviour or failure to comply with these Visitor Regulations, the purchased admission ticket shall be cancelled and become invalid for re-entry to the Event territory.

10.15. Part of the Event content will be provided in English and may not be translated.

XI. Safety

11.1. Motorsport can be dangerous! Despite all safety and precautionary measures taken by the Organiser, unforeseen accidents may occur in motorsport.

11.2. Visitors are fully responsible for their own safety at the Event venue.

11.3. Visitors must continuously assess whether their safety at the Event venue is not at risk.

11.4. The Organiser or its authorised persons have the right not to admit persons to the Event venue or to expel them from the Event venue if visitor behaviour disturbs or may disturb the Event, or endangers other visitors and/or the Organiser and/or the athletes' safety and health, or if visitors do not comply with these Regulations or with the Organiser's instructions and orders. Visitors who are expelled from the Event will have their admission ticket blocked and will not be allowed to return to the Event.

11.5. For security reasons, visitors may be searched at the entrance to the Event.

11.6. It is strictly prohibited to bring weapons, explosives, intoxicating substances or alcohol into the Event venue. If any of the aforementioned items are found in a visitor's possession,

the Organiser or its authorised persons have the right to confiscate them and expel the visitor from the Event venue.

11.7. Visitors are prohibited from bringing any means of transport (including motorised) into the Event venue, such as bicycles, roller skates, skateboards, hoverboards or scooters. At the entrance to the territory, there will be an appropriate place where these means of transport may be left; however, their safety shall be the responsibility of each owner.

11.8. During the Event it is prohibited to throw any objects onto the track.

11.9. At the entrance to the Event venue, items that are prohibited in the territory will be confiscated (professional video equipment, photo and video tripods, narcotics and other intoxicating substances, food, alcoholic beverages, as well as non-alcoholic beverages (this prohibition does not apply to special food and beverages for infants and children up to 3 (three) years of age), bulky items and items that may endanger the comfort or safety of other visitors, the Organiser or athletes (weapons, explosives, knives, gas sprays, laser pointers, glass items, metal and wooden flagpoles, and other items and objects which the Organiser or staff involved in security may consider unsafe at the Event venue and during the Event).

11.10. It is strictly prohibited to bring, use, sell or store narcotic substances at the Event venue.

11.11. The Organiser assumes no responsibility for injuries sustained by visitors during the Event at the Event venue.

11.12. The Event Organiser assumes no responsibility for any damage to visitors' personal belongings, or for lost or stolen items.

11.13. It is prohibited to use open fire at the Event venue.

11.14. It is prohibited to bring animals into the Event venue.

11.15. Event visitors must follow the instructions of the Organiser and its authorised persons, including security and guard staff.

11.16. The Organiser or its authorised persons reserve the right not to admit (including not to re-admit after expulsion) persons to the Event venue who could interfere with the activities of athletes or their teams or endanger the safety and health or life of other Event visitors and/or the Organiser and/or the athletes.

11.17. Visitors are obliged to take care of their own safety and life while staying in the paddock and throughout the Event venue.

11.18. Various objects may fly from the track – visitors are responsible for their own safety and the safety of children and youth under their supervision while in the Event venue.

XII. Environment

12.1. For access to the territory, the Organiser encourages visitors to present a digital admission ticket on a smart device instead of using printed tickets.

12.2. Event visitors are obliged to treat the environment with care.

12.3. Always clean up after yourself when leaving!

12.4. Respect other people's property and follow the Organiser's instructions regarding environmental protection!

XIII. Cars / Parking

13. The Organiser provides parking spaces for Event visitors; the types and prices of parking during the Event are indicated below. The availability, number and location of parking areas may be amended or expanded by the Organiser as necessary.

13.2. Parking is not included in the Event admission ticket price; if necessary, it must be purchased separately.

13.3. The Organiser assumes no responsibility if the QR code or barcode on the parking ticket presented by the visitor cannot be scanned.

13.4. The Organiser assumes no responsibility for cars parked near or within the Event venue, nor for belongings left in the cars.

13.5. The Organiser assumes no responsibility for Event visitors who do not comply with Road Traffic Regulations or who park vehicles in prohibited places. The visitor is responsible for parking vehicles in prohibited places. The State Police and Municipal Police have the right to impose penalties in accordance with applicable laws and regulations. The Event Organiser is not responsible for such penalties.

13.6. Parking without a valid parking ticket or special permit is considered unauthorised vehicle parking. In such cases, a fine may be imposed on the visitor.

13.7. The Organiser provides parking spaces for persons with disabilities, but these are intended only for persons with disabilities who hold a valid disabled parking card. In order to use this parking, a disabled parking space (0 EUR) must be purchased (reserved) on the website www.bilesuparadize.lv, as the number of spaces is limited.

XIV. Camper Parking and Rules

14.1. The Organiser provides the following camper parking spaces for Event visitors; the types and prices during the Event are indicated below.

14.2. The camper parking price includes:

14.2.1. Parking space for the camper;

14.2.2. WC;

14.2.3. Drinking water;

14.2.4. Showers located in the territory of the Sports and Recreation Base "Smeceres sils", available from 8:00 to 22:00 (Friday, Saturday) and from 8:00 to 18:00 (Sunday);

14.2.5. Electricity is not provided.

XV. Tent Area Information and Rules

15.1. The Organiser provides Event visitors with the possibility to set up tents in a specially designated area at the Sports and Recreation Base "Smeceres sils".

15.2. The tent area is located at the Sports and Recreation Base "Smeceres sils", 1.5 km through the forest to the World Championship track (Event venue).

15.3. The tent area fee is 3 EUR per person per 24 hours (parking must be purchased separately).

15.4. The following are available near the tent area: WC/toilets, showers.

15.5. To purchase a tent place, Event visitors must call: +371 29347575 (Sports and Recreation Base "Smeceres sils" reception). Reservations are possible from 1 June 2026.
